SERVING THE KINGDOM

'For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in.' ... 'When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine you did for me.' - Matthew 25:35 & 39-40

You can watch the national news or drive by any major intersection in Anchorage and the homeless problem is evident. Have we satisfied the King if we hand a dollar out the window, or encourage the assembly to throw money at the problem?

Governments, by their nature, are soulless. They are capable of providing: housing, food, treatment, etc., but this is only a hand-out. They can not heal the soul. The King has called us to a hand-up.

The Downtown Hope Center, formally the Downtown Soup Kitchen, is the King's calling to the homeless issue in Anchorage. To maintain the DHC's spiritual focus it accepts no public funding. They provide a multiple prong approach: afternoon soup, shower house, and a women's shelter. For those wishing a hand-up, they offer a culinary arts and bakery training program. To complete either program a student attends a faith-based life skills class. The expanding vision for the DHC includes: transitional housing for students as they move from the streets to a job and a storefront bakery to market their goods.

Will you answer the King's call to provide hope when all appears lost? Volunteers are the hands and feet of the operation. To make and serve lunch is to stand alongside the culinary arts student in their final phase before entering the workforce. Working in the shower house is an opportunity to interact and pray as a client's clothes are being washed and dried. Serving dinner to the sheltered women at night is an opening to share His gift of hope. There are volunteer possibilities to meet any schedule. Children are always welcome with their parents. In fact, a child's smile can often lead to a fruitful conversation. This is a perfect way to bring the family together in service to the King.

In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: "It is more blessed to give than to receive." Acts 20:35.

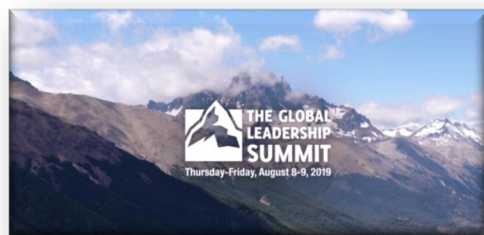

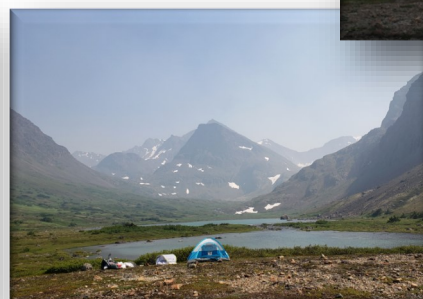
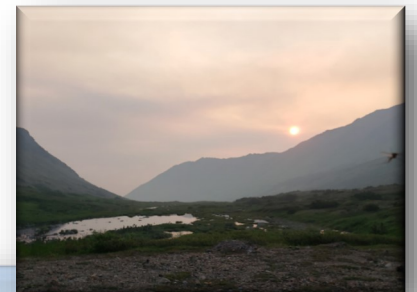

4th of July BBQ - July 4

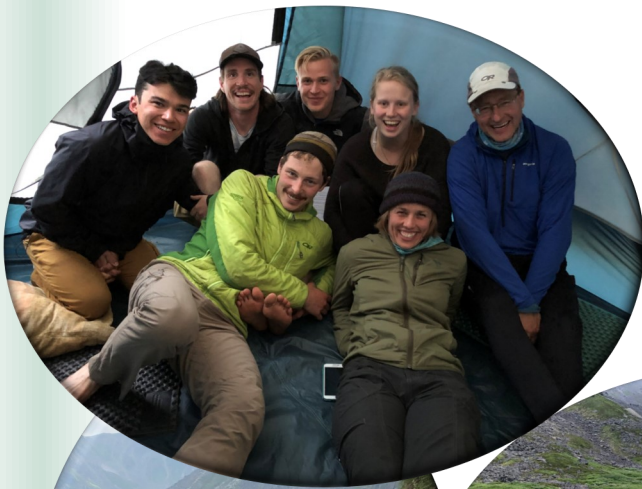

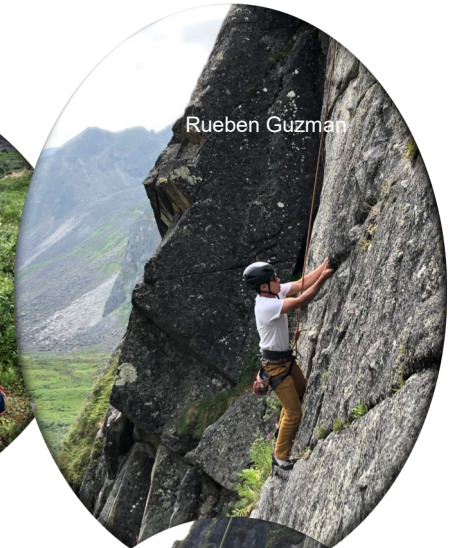
